




CONNECTICUT PRINCE HALL SCOTTISH RITE HISTORY

The first Scottish Rite organization among African-Americans was the African Grand Council of 1820 in Philadelphia, which was referred to as a Council of Princes of Jerusalem. This Council arose through West Indian migration, for Stephen Morin had propagated the Rite there. The organization of the King David Supreme Council grew out of conferring in Philadelphia (1850) of the 33rd Degree by Count DeSaint Laurent of the Supreme Council of Spain on David Leary, the first Black Inspector General of the Prince Hall Scottish Rite.

Scottish Rite Masonry came to Connecticut on August 20, 1892. New Haven Consistory No. 7 was chartered September 29, 1892 with Illustrious Robert L. Reed as its first Illustrious Commander-in-Chief. Brother Reed later served as the Sovereign Grand Commander of the United Supreme Council, Northern Jurisdiction from 1897-1898. Illustrious George W. Crawford, 33° of New Haven, served as Sovereign Grand Commander from 1949 through 1965. Our present Sovereign Grand Commander is Illustrious Brother Solomon Wallace, 33°, of Queens, New York.





Kountz first came to News Channel 8 in 1987 as a reporter. Shortly thereafter he was promoted to Weekend Anchor. In 1994 he became co-anchor of Connecticut's top rated early morning newscast "Good Morning Connecticut at 5am" and "Good Morning Connecticut at 6am". Kountz also co-anchored News Channel 8 at noon. In 1998, Kountz left Connecticut to become a main anchor at WJXX in Jacksonville, Florida.

"I'm so thrilled to be back", says Keith. "Connecticut is like home to me. I love the area, my family loves the area and being back is a dream come true". He goes on to say "the people of News Channel 8 are like family. I've known Ann, Mel and Geoff for over a decade. They're more than co-workers, they're friends and they make the work environment that much better".

While at WTNH, Kountz received acclaim for his news series called "Who We Are", which focused on individuals, organizations and issues important to minorities throughout the state. He also hosted "Wednesday's Child", a weekly series that featured children in need of adoption. As a part of the greater New Haven community for more than 13 years, Keith has worked closely with a variety of charities. Some of these include the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation, Big Brothers / Big Sisters and the Boys and Girls Club.

Before working in New Haven, Keith served in a similar capacity at WIXT-TV in Syracuse, New York. He has also worked at WSAV-TV in Savannah, Georgia and WPDE-TV in Florence, South Carolina. Keith has been the recipient of more than 40 civic and professional awards, including the Greater New Haven NAACP Media Award (2000), the Greater New Haven 40 Under 40 Award (1997) and LIN Television's "Circle of Excellence" award.

An avid golfer, Keith and his wife Dawn are the parents of two daughters.
